

**QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS IN
"KEEP PLEASANTVILLE GREEN"**

- Q. What is the "Keep Pleasantville Green" Program?
- A. "Keep Pleasantville Green" is a community street tree planting program, designed to supplement and enhance Pleasantville's aging street tree stock. Made possible only through the cooperation of the Village and its residents, the program's goal is to "Keep Pleasantville Green" for present and future residents.
- Q. Who is entitled to trees?
- A. Any property owner with frontage on a Village street, providing the tree can be planted within the area designated in "Guidelines for Locating Your Tree." Trees will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis with the date of application used to establish the list. Those not receiving trees this year will be put on a waiting list to receive trees as funds permit.
- Q. Where can I plant the tree?
- A. Trees will be planted by the Village's contractor at a site selected by you, and subject to approval by the Village.
- Generally, the tree must be planted in your front lawn, 15' from the street curb and clear of obstacles and other trees. See the "Guidelines for Locating Your Tree" for more specifics.
- Q. Who owns and maintains the tree?
- A. The tree, planted by the Village on your property, will be owned by you, but maintained for one year by the Village. Thereafter, it is your responsibility, with the sole proviso being that you cannot remove it without Village permission.
- Q. How much will the tree cost?
- A. The tree will cost approximately \$300.00, but you will pay only \$75.00. The balance will be paid by the Village.
- Q. How big is the tree?
- A. The tree will be 2 to 2 1/2" in diameter with a height of 10 to 12'. Several varieties are available and are listed in the section "Choice of Trees."
- Q. How do I apply for a tree?
- A. Complete the application in this brochure. A contract regarding the tree will be signed when the \$75 tree fee is paid.
