August 4: We were proud to introduce our Hope not Handcuffs Program to the community.

Lastly, I was honored to speak at a ceremony in honor of the 20 year anniversary of 9/11.

September 10: We were notified that a large youth party was going to be held at a local business. While these are alcohol-free events, the possibility for attendees to sneak in alcohol or other illegal substances for consumption is a concern.



- The Detective Division worked with one of our intel partners, the Westchester County Real Time Crime Center, to monitor social media and develop a report on the event.
- In addition, they worked to liaise with the promoters and venue owners to express our concerns and plan for contingencies.
- Although the incident went off without a need for police response, there was an incident at the location which required follow-up. Our advanced preparation increased our ability to respond appropriately.

- September 9: An 18 year-old man with special needs was having difficulty regulating his behavior and began acting out at home. His mother got him outside and called police. Upon the officers arrival, he was visibly agitated and rushed at them.
- Sgt. Caccamise, PO Bangurra, Det. Zane, Lt. Wollman and I were able to safely control his movements. Upon the arrival of the paramedic, the young man was administered medication to sedate him, and transported to the hospital without injury or further incident.

- August 13: An 52 year-old man with a cardiac history had a heart attack at the Pleasantville Country Club. Bystanders began CPR and a 911 call was placed. Upon arrival, the officers found the man unresponsive, with no breathing and no pulse.
- Sgt. Gilmartin and PO Smith took over CPR and utilized our Automatic External Defibrillator. The man was revived and regained consciousness prior to transport to the hospital.



Q3 Overtime: 841.75 hours


## Staffing and Overtime: Patrol

In addition, Det. Zane attended the Advanced Cell Phone Investigation Course in September.


## Areas of Concern
