BLOTTER SUMMARY

December 19 through December 25, 2022

The Blotter reports below represent a selection of reports made between the dates above.

12/19/2022 5:32am County Fire Control reported a commercial carbon monoxide alarm activation at a business on Bedford Road. Officers and FD gained access to the business using a lockbox key. Following affirmative readings for carbon monoxide throughout the first floor, Con Edison was contacted. It was later determined that there was a small leak in the boiler in the basement, which Con Edison repaired without incident. Officers remained on scene and secured the building upon their exit.

12/19/2022 8:09am The central monitoring station for an alarm company reported a commercial burglary alarm at a business on Wheeler Avenue. Units were dispatched and reported the business was secured and it was a false alarm.

12/20/2022 2:30am Fire Control reported a diabetic emergency at a residence in the village. Upon their arrival, officers were met by the patient, who was combative due to her hyperglycemic state, so officers worked to maintain her safety during the medical evaluation. The ambulance and paramedic were dispatched, and the patient was transported to the hospital for further medical care by Pleasantville VAC.

12/20/2022 3:21pm A witness reported an aggressive driver who drove into oncoming traffic, to access a service station on Pleasantville Road. The responding officer located the driver, a 45-year-old resident of Mahopac, and checked his license. Since the violation did not occur in the Officer's presence, he was issued a warning regarding his unsafe operation of the vehicle.

12/20/2022 8:04pm A woman requested assistance in her residence at the Clinton Street Center after she had fallen and could not get up on her own. Responding officers determined the woman was not injured and were able to help her up. 12/20/2022 9:51pm The emergency medical subscription service reported another situation in the same apartment in the Clinton Street Center, but this time there was no answer on the call back. Officers responded and found the resident had fallen again, and was not injured. Officers again rendered assistance, and further medical interventions were refused.

12/21/2022 5:46am The emergency medical subscription service reported the woman at the Clinton Street Center had fallen again and was not injured. Officers were able to again help her upright.

12/21/2022 12:25pm A Village employee discovered graffiti in a bathroom at Soldier's and Sailor's Field. Responding officers photographed the damaged property and started a case for further investigation by the Detective Division.

12/21/2022 1:16pm A Village resident reported that she had noticed suspicious activity on her bank accounts. When she spoke to the bank, they advised her that another account had been opened and linked to her account, and money had been transferred there. Upon the discovery, the funds were credited back to the correct account and the new account was closed. Officers made a report to document the transactions for the bank to investigate.

12/22/2022 1:25am The landlord of a multi-family dwelling on Washington Avenue reported loud noises and a possible dispute involving the tenants of her first-floor apartment. Upon officer's arrival, they determined the argument was verbal in nature only. A NY State Domestic Incident Report was prepared, and since no crimes had been committed, both parties merely agreed to separate for the remainder of the evening.

12/22/2022 9:12am A resident of Bedford Road reported wires down blocking access to her driveway. Officers confirmed the wires were not live and Verizon Fios was notified to respond for service. The officers removed the wires to allow access to the driveways affected.

12/23/2022 10:18am MTA Police reported three people stuck in the elevator in the breezeway over the train tracks. Pleasantville FD was dispatched, and responding officers assisted with the operations until MTA PD officers arrived on scene.

12/23/2022 4:21pm A resident of Edgewood Avenue came to Police HQ to report that while he was walking, he was bitten by a dog owned by a family on Washington Avenue, causing some small puncture wounds. The dog's owner was contacted, and she confirmed the story and provided veterinary information for follow-up. A dog bite form was completed for submission to the Department of Health.

The man had left the area, but a description was provided, and he was located by responding officers a short time later. The victim declined to press charges, as the items were of no value. During the interview process, however, the thief, a 58-year-old resident of White Plains, began to complain of chest pain. The ambulance and a paramedic were dispatched, and the thief was transported to the hospital via Pleasantville VAC.

12/23/2022 11:50pm The central monitoring station for an alarm company reported a commercial alarm activation at a business on Marble Avenue. Officers checked the exterior of the building and found it secure on the ground level.

12/24/2022 12:32pm A resident of Academy Street requested assistance with a lock out of her vehicle, which she had left running in the roadway. The responding officer was able to gain access to the vehicle.

12/24/2022 2:49pm The central monitoring station for an alarm company reported a fire alarm with sprinkler activation at a restaurant on Wheeler Avenue. Pleasantville FD was dispatched, and officers determined that a frozen pipe had caused the sprinkler to leak.

The vehicle had been parked in front of his unit for the past few days, so the timing of the theft could not be precisely determined, but information sharing with other neighboring police agencies uncovered similar thefts in other jurisdictions on two of the nights in question. Responding officers found the vehicle locked, and a canvass for the operator was negative. The vehicle was impounded, and officers attempted to discover the condition of the driver. A neighbor's video provided footage of the incident and indicated that the driver had been picked up by another vehicle after the accident had occurred. An investigation is underway.

Responding officers canvassed the area and broadcast a description of the man and his vehicle to neighboring police agencies. The vehicle's location was determined to be in Ossining, and Ossining PD officers located the man in their jurisdiction unharmed.

12/25/2022 4:15pm A resident of Bedford Road reported that her 1 ½-year-old nephew had fallen and injured his head. EMS was dispatched, and the responding officers observed what appeared to be a small contusion on the bridge of the child's nose, but no other injuries or signs of distress. Following a medical evaluation, the paramedic determined that the child had no lingering injuries, and the ambulance was canceled when the parents refused further medical attention.

12/25/2022 5:58pm The owner of a convenience store flagged down an officer to assist a motorist who had locked his keys inside his car with the motor running. The officer was able to gain entry to the vehicle.

12/25/2022 8:38pm The owner of a local commercial establishment on Marble Avenue reported a person lingering inside without any business to conduct. Responding officers interviewed the man, who lives on Washington Avenue, and he left of his own accord.
